



About the Author and Lyricist:


Mo Willems is a number one New York Times best-selling author and illustrator. He has been awarded a Caldecott Honor, and was an inaugural inductee into the Indies Choice Picture Book Hall of Fame for Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus! His Elephant & Piggie early reader series has been rewarded two Theodor Seuss Geisel Medals, and five Geisel Honors. Mo Willems started his career as a Sesame Street writer and animator, garnering six Emmy Awards in his time.

About the Author and Lyricist:

Mr. Warburton is best known as the creator of the action-packed original series Codename: Kids Next Door. He has helped produce, design, and direct many other animated shows. Recent projects include collaborating with his best pal, children's book author Mo Willems, on a musical based on Mo's best-selling book Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus for the Kennedy Center as well as an animated production of Naked Mole Rat Gets Dressed: The Rock Opera Experience

Jacob Kalvoda - Business Man, Hot Dog Vendor, Backup Bus 1







Writing Activities

- If you were a Mo Willems character, what would you be? Draw yourself as that character on a piece of paper. Give yourself a name, and write a couple of sentences about your life.
- 2 4 Write your own story as Pigeon. What do you want and what is your obstacle? Make sure to include a beginning, a middle and an end in your story.
- Pigeon is tenacious (determined/ambitious). When he finds something he likes, he doesn't give up until he gets what he wants. Write about a time where you REALLY wanted something and how you got what you wanted.
- Pigeon and the Bus Driver help each other fulfill their dreams and achieve their goals. They show kindness, compassion, and caring for one another and those around them. How do you show kindness and caring for the people in your life?
- Should Pigeon get to drive the bus? Why, or why not? Make sure to use punctuation and capital letters!
- Summarize the story of "Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus: The Musical". What happened in the beginning? What happened in the middle? How did it end? Make sure to use details from the story, and use your best writing and editing skills!



Critical Thinking Activity: Cause & Effect



In a cause and effect relationship, one event leads another to happen. The cause is why it happened, and the effect is what happened.

On one side of this page is the "cause" column. The other side is the "effect" column.

Using these events from *Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus!*, draw a line to match the acceptable cause on the left to its effect on the right.
